How we spend our additional funding:

SEN (Special Educational Needs) funding

In 2014-15 (financial year), we have had £9,636 of our budget delegated to supporting our SEN pupils. This has been spent on:

- Providing 6 hours per week Senior Teaching Assistant support (£3000)
- Providing 2 hours per week of a Learning Support Assistant to deliver small group interventions (£1000)
- Providing 4 hours per week of an additional teacher to teach groups containing SEN pupils and deliver small group interventions (£4000)
- £600 on training (and supply cover to enable this)
- £1036 on resources, including tablet computers and software

In addition, we receive further 'High Needs' funding direct from the Local Authority to support pupils with statements of SEN - this is all spent on the additional provision required by each pupil's statement and Individual Pupil Plan (IPP), which mostly consists of providing specified numbers of hours of support for those pupils from Learning Support/Teaching Assistants.

Impact: The impact of this spending is good as all SEN pupils have benefited, making progress as a result on their IPP targets, with a majority of pupils demonstrating good progress over the year in most subjects and 50% making more than expected progress in at least one core subject (Summer 2014 assessments). In 2014 Y6 SATs, SEN pupils had excellent results, with floor standards or above achieved in all but 1 subject. This shows our provision is ensuring that SEN pupils are closing the gap in achievement and progress with their peers.

Currently (end February 2015), all SEN pupils are on track towards achieving end of year expectations in core subjects and/or IPP targets.

In 2015-16 (financial year), we have £7,585 of our budget delegated to supporting our SEN pupils. As the impact of our current spending has been good, we plan to continue to spend this in a similar way to the 2014-15 budget.
